
New NMC Midwifery Standards for Proficiency and Preregistration Midwifery programmes, both published November 2019

The proficiency standards specify the knowledge, understanding and skills that midwives must demonstrate at the point of qualification. The standards for pre-registration midwifery programmes set out underpinning requirements.

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NMC Standards for Student Supervision & Assessment New standard replaces previous system of mentors / sign-off mentors

Three key roles:

- Practice Supervisor (PS)
- Practice Assessor (PA)
- Academic Assessor (AA)



The new NMC standards for student supervision and assessment

- No longer mentors/sign-off mentors
- Practice Supervisors (PS) work with students on shift by shift basis. Can be any registered health or social care practitioner. No NMC stipulation for continuity, but for development and PS satisfaction continuity still preferable
- **Practice Assessors (PA)** a registered midwife with some preparation of student assessment. (equates to sign-off mentor). The PA does not work with their nominated students. They oversee progress by reviewing evidence and in collaboration with Practice Supervisors. Responsible for summative assessment
- Academic Assessors (AA) support the student, the PS and the PA

2020-2021

- Sep 2018 Cohort will commence their final year PAD/ROME for their skills and competencies. They will continue to be graded in practice as this is the pathway these students are already on
- Sep 2019 Cohort will transition to the new national MORA (Midwifery Ongoing Record of Achievement)
- Sep 2020 will join clinical practice area from January 2021 and use the MORA
- The MORA is a single document that spans all three years of clinical practice assessments. Students will no longer be graded in practice

Practice Supervisor (PS)

- Supports learning in line with their scope of practice to enable the student to meet their proficiencies and programme outcomes
- Supports and supervises students, providing feedback on their progress towards, and achievement of, proficiencies and skills
- Has current knowledge and experience of the area in which they are providing support, supervision and feedback and
- Receives ongoing support to participate in the practice learning of students
- Formerly associated to being a mentor can be from other professions.



Practice Assessor (PA)

- Practice assessors conduct assessments to confirm student achievement of proficiencies and programme outcomes for practice learning
- Assessment decisions by practice assessors are informed by feedback from practice supervisors
- Practice assessors make and record objective, evidenced-based assessments on conduct, proficiency and achievement, drawing on student records, direct observations, student selfreflection, and other resources
- Formally associated to being a sign off mentor



Academic Assessor (AA) • Academic assessors collate and confirm student achievement of proficiencies and

- Academic assessors collate and confirm student achievement of proficiencies and programme outcomes in the academic environment for each part of the programme
- The nominated academic assessor works in partnership with a nominated practice assessor to evaluate and recommend the student for progression for each part of the programme, in line with programme standards and local and national policies
- Academic assessors understands the student's learning and achievement in practice
- Communication and collaboration between academic and practice assessors is scheduled for relevant points in programme structure and student progression


