City of Sanctuary, which began in October 2005 in Sheffield, holds the vision that the UK will be a welcoming place of safety for all, and proud to offer sanctuary to people fleeing violence and persecution. There are currently over 100 villages, towns, cities and regions across the UK promoting the City of Sanctuary vision. Organisations have also become 'Streams of Sanctuary', such as libraries, universities, schools and health services.

The University of Sussex Sanctuary Group and Brighton & Hove Sanctuary on Sea invite you to a talk by Inderjit Bhogal, OBE. Inderjit is founder and Patron of the City of Sanctuary movement. He is also the recipient of the World Methodist Peace Award (2018) for his interfaith efforts toward justice for all people without prejudice. Inderjit will share his insights and reflections on the Sanctuary movement, which will be followed by an informal discussion of current and future Sanctuary initiatives - at the University and throughout the wider community.
