Welcome to the November issue of our monthly newsletter.

As I write this, it's still not exactly clear what the plan is in terms of students remaining here until the end of the month, getting tested (possibly) and then going home early, bearing in mind that for many of our students, Brighton or Eastbourne is already home.

Whatever happens, the issue remains of members of staff being expected to work in conditions which are problematic as far as Covid goes.

We're concerned that whether a class needs to take place or a service provided on-site or virtually is now down to the judgement of an individual head or director, leading to a load of inconsistent decisions being made. We think that those closest to the delivery i.e. the people who do the work, are best placed to determine what's appropriate from a health and safety point of view. If people feel that they are being put at unnecessary risk, either

because what they are doing is not essential, or because the risk factors have not be sufficiently mitigated, they should discuss this with their line manager and if necessary, contact us for advice. Whilst the risk may be relatively low, nobody should be working, or commuting when they are worried about catching a potentially deadly illness.

There are two important votes and ballots taking place this month.

- The consultative vote on the 0% pay "rise".
 Please make sure you respond to the email and tell them we're rejecting it!
- The massive postal ballot of 1.3 million members to determine who the next general secretary will be. Please make sure you vote!

Throughout November, University of Brighton employed members will be emailed a vote, asking for their view on the pay deal. In case you missed it, we were "offered" 0%, and so our wages went up by precisely naff all in August 2020.

We all know we're worth more than this imposed real-terms pay cut and so voting to reject the "offer" is a straightforward choice and what we recommend, but obviously it's up to you.

The more pertinent question is what are we going to do about it, and how are we going to mount an effective and credible campaign when Covid has made the future so uncertain?

We think that sending a clear and loud message to the employers that we're prepared to take action is necessary, so please make sure that you respond to the email (which will have gone to the email address held on UNISON's membership system.)

If you don't have it, please get in touch and we'll sort that out.

You have until 5pm on 30th November.

General Secretary Election - make sure you use your vote!

Throughout November, over a million members get to democratically decide who gets to be the next General Secretary of UNISON.

You should, by now, have received a ballot paper. This will have gone to your home address on UNISON's membership system, so if you don't have one, either you joined after the cut-off point (28th July) or your address details are out of date.


If you need to get in touch with us to check your details, feel free to give us a call or drop us an email.
