Globalisation: History, Politics, Culture BA(Hons)

Year 1

In your first year you take six modules that help develop the skills central to your course.

Modules

- Understanding Society in a Global World
- Historical Inquiry
- Studying Cultures
- Democracy: From Athens to Baghdad
- The Politics of Representation
- Philosophical Inquiry

Year 2 and 3

In year 2 you choose two option pathways to follow for the rest of your degree. You'll also take core modules and start researching your dissertation project which you complete through Year 3.

Core modules

In Critical Traditions you will explore some of the key debates and concepts in history, culture and politics.

Specialist pathways

Either choose two specialist pathways from:

- Global Politics
- Globalisation, History and Identity
- Global Society

Or one specialist pathway, and one from the wider humanities programme:

- War, Violence and Mass Killings
- Politics of the Past
- Politics, History and Ideology
- 'Race' and Resistance
- Self and Society
- Culture and Conflict
- Terror and Terrorism
- Literature, History and Social Change
- Critical Theory and Radical Politics
- Morality, Politics and the Good Life
- Philosophy and Literature
- Radical Histories
