




Have you had any formal teaching as a medical student on how to perform a ward round?




#### If yes, what form did this teaching take?

### Have you taken an active role during ward rounds as a medical student on clinical attachment?




#### If yes, how many?



## Have you had practice in documenting in the medical notes as a student?




### Have you had practice in prescribing as a student?




#### Please indicate your current confidence in leading a ward round (1=not confident, 5=very confident)




**POST-Training** 







**PRE-Training** 









Mean Pre-Training Score = 3 Mean Post-Training Score = 3.09 Mean change in Score after training = 0

#### **How would you rate this session?** (1=poor, 5=excellent)




#### How could this session be improved?

- More information on role of each person in a ward round (? A handout on this)
- Rather than taking a lead in every scenario, it would have been useful to have one scenario with a senior member just to show us what it would be like to be an FY1 under pressure and speedy ward rounds
- All have a chance to lead
- More scenarios
- Longer
- By allowing groups two goes at practicing
- Provide a structure for writing in the notes
- Intended outcome not completely clear. Maybe need to clarify slightly more beforehand
- It would have been useful to have a consultant
- Show the wardround checklist before the first scenario
- Slightly longer time for scenario
- More hands on and interactive for whole group, more scenarios, smaller groups
- Initial instruction to what you are doing
- Circulate scenarios
- More direction
- Not realistic having 5 FY1s on one round!
- Maybe 3 small groups of 3 or 4?
- Smaller groups so everyone has a chance to lead
- Smaller groups


### Do you feel a safety checklist increases confidence on the ward round?
