A reminder of why your involvement is important

The most common complication of shingles is post-herpetic neuralgia, an unpleasant "nerve pain" which persists after the shingles rash has gone.

Amitriptyline is commonly used to treat nerve pain but we do not know whether it can also prevent post herpetic neuralgia.

A study over 20 years ago suggested that it may but it was small and poorly done. Our study will find out for sure whether amitriptyline should be routinely used in this way. Only with the results from this study can we be sure of the best thing to do.



Study Recap and Update

We are delighted to tell you that we have recruited 859 participants so far and will continue recruiting until the end of April 2025.

Early next year, we will be able to let you know whether you were given placebo or amitriptyline.

We have 331 surgeries taking part in the study within 11 UK regions. You can view the location of recruiting surgeries in these regions via our interactive <u>map</u>.



Questionnaires

A BIG thank you to everyone for continuing to complete your questionnaires!

Please remember....

- ...to continue to complete the questionnaires <u>even when you</u> <u>aren't taking the medication anymore</u>.
- ... when answering questions about pain to include all kinds of pain or discomfort in the area of your shingles rash, including that triggered by air blowing on the skin, by clothing rubbing against the skin, or by hot or cold temperatures.
- ...to look out for the emailed questionnaires (check your "spam") if you are completing them online, or in the post, if you are completing them on paper.
- ... to complete as many questions as you can and remember to press 'submit' at the end.
