Other ideas for recruiting vulnerable women /non-English speakers:

- We are trialing the usefulness of having the PIS and consent form in some of the more common languages. The first available will be in Romanian. We will send these out to you soon; please let us know other languages that might be helpful and your thoughts on this idea
- Ask booking midwives to invite you to speak to women during the appointment while they are doing paperwork (when interpreters are there)
- Invite women to come in to an appointment specially to discuss the research if they haven't got time after their appointment (many do!).
- Set up a WhatsApp for the recruiting team to help you communicate & follow up anybody who has been missed
- Consider vulnerable/high risk women who are eligible for the study but who may have been directed to other specialist pathways – could they have their midwifery care in Pregnancy Circles?
- Develop processes to pick up late bookers (up to 2nd session at 25:40)
- Suggest that they try the first Circle – they can always return to standard care if they don't like it (more vulnerable women are less likely to understand what's involved in research)
- Consider including toddlers in your group – women from BME backgrounds are more likely to have larger families & less childcare.
- **DON'T MAKE ASSUMPTIONS.** Let women decide about taking part: always ask!
