With the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther's protest against the Catholic Church, on 31st October 1517 fast approaching, second year History students are hosting an exhibition at St Martin's Priory, Canterbury Christ Church University. This 16th/17th century grade two listed building sets the perfect scene to spark off an evening surrounded by contemporary pamphlet literature from Early Modern England.

Looking at the post-Reformation era opens up a number of questions and avenues of investigation. This exhibition explores the impact that the English Reformation had on men and women's understanding of the world surrounding them.

Students will present their research findings from their second year history module – Sex, Deviance and Death in Early Modern England - in which guests will have the opportunity to learn more about how the English Reformation changed perceptions and phenomena around fairies, witchcraft, death, monstrous births, demonology and superstition.
