

Travel Survey 2019

Report Summary

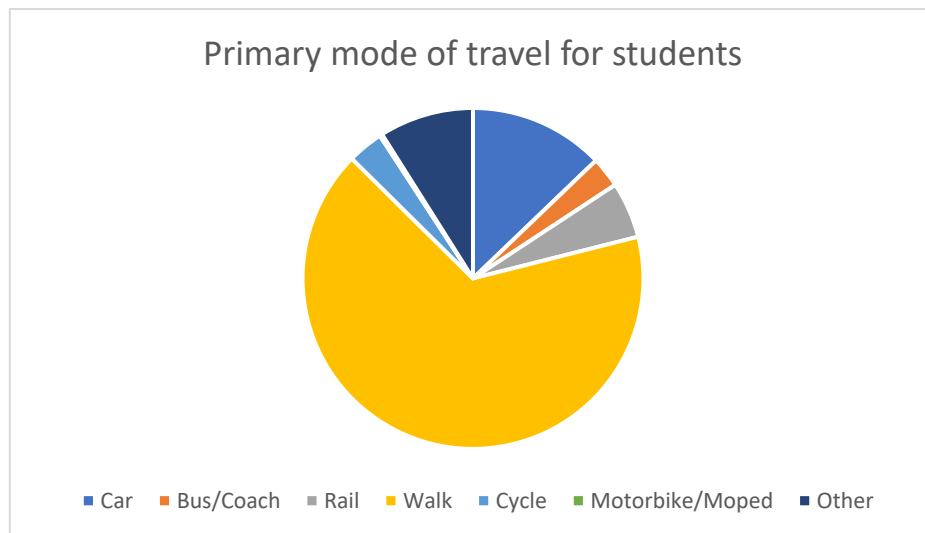
The bi-annual staff and student travel surveys were conducted in October 2019.

There were 841 responses from University staff (38% / 56% response rate), and 450 student responses (3% response rate).

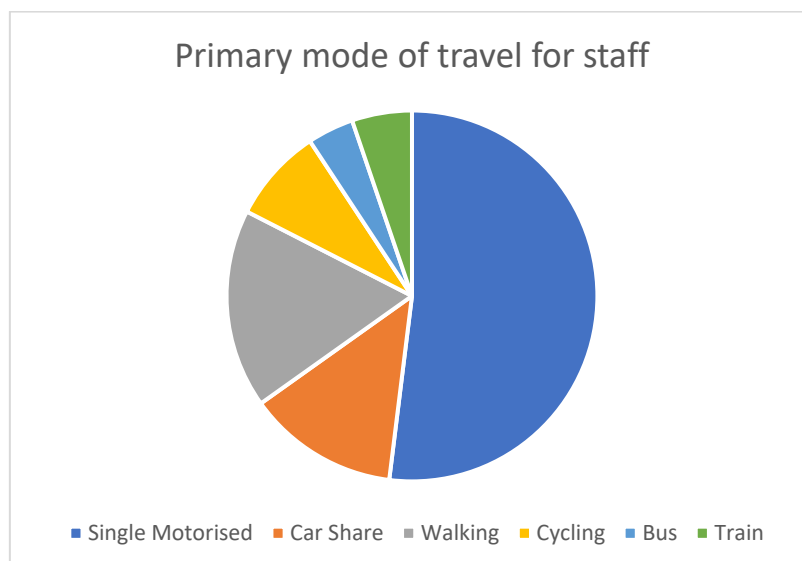
Overview of key findings

The staff and student surveys present different interpretations and levels of satisfaction with the current travel infrastructure at the University.

For students, the sample suggests that 66% of students walk to University from their university address. This ranks the UoL highly in comparison to other UK Universities, and is due to the compact nature of our campus and proximity of student accommodation in the city centre.



For staff on the other hand, 65% of respondents said that they travel to work by car.



Of Staff who travel to work by car as their primary mode of transport, 437 respondents said they were in a single occupancy car. This suggests a total single occupancy vehicle travel percentage of 52%.

The University has made a commitment to achieving a year-on-year 10% reduction single occupancy car employee travel. In 2017, it was reported that 53% of employees travelled by car, therefore this number has decreased by 1%.
