<p>Literacy and English</p> <p>Share a story every day then talk about the story. Can you describe the character? What was your favourite part? What do you think they might do next? Can you retell/draw the story?</p>	<p>Numeracy and Mathematics</p> <p>Pick a number between 0 and 20. Count forwards from this number. Can you also count backwards to get back to the number you started from? Challenge: Can you make a number line to show your counting?</p>	<p>Health and Wellbeing</p> <p>Make a kindness calendar, plan an act of kindness for each month of 2022 or challenge yourself to a week of kindness before christmas or a month of kindness in January.</p>
<p>Literacy and English</p> <p>Watch some of this year's Christmas adverts on youtube. Choose your favourite advert and draw a scene from it. Could you add your own ideas. E.g. John Lewis ad - what else could the alien discover? Aldi - What other food could come to life? Disney - What does the dog get from Santa?</p>	<p>Numeracy and Mathematics</p> <p>Roll a dice, draw the dot pattern. Roll the dice again and draw the new dot pattern. How many dots are there when you add them together? Challenge: Once you've done this 5 times, can you order your answers from smallest to largest?</p>	<p>STEM</p> <p>Use salt dough to create a christmas decoration. There are lots of ideas online. Here is an easy recipe for the dough. https://www.bbcgoodfood.com/howto/guide/how-make-salt-dough-recipe</p>
<p>Literacy and English</p> <p>Can you write a shopping list for your Christmas dinner? What treats would you add to the trolley? Talk about which things would be in the same aisle, why are they grouped together?</p>	<p>Numeracy and Mathematics</p> <p>Draw a line. Write 0 at one end and 20 at the other end. Ask someone to say a number, can you point to where the number should be? Challenge: write the numbers instead of pointing.</p>	<p>Expressive Arts</p> <p>Ask the members of your family what their favourite christmas song is. Find out why they like it. How does it make them feel? Is it connected to a memory? Listen to the songs and sing or dance along.</p>
<p>Literacy and English</p> <p>Play a memory game. 1st person says: I went to the shops and I bought (item1) 2nd person says: I went to the shops and I bought (item 1) and (item 2)</p>	<p>Numeracy and Mathematics</p> <p>Take a look at a calendar (you can get simple ones on google) Talk about December. E.g. What day is it tomorrow? How many days until Christmas day? What day is Christmas Day? What month comes next? Challenge: Write today's date in words and numbers</p>	<p>Social Studies</p> <p>Find out about Christmas in another country. What do they eat? Do they have gifts? Do they celebrate on the same day? How do they decorate their homes?</p>
