



### First Level Home Learning Grid

<p><b>Literacy and English</b></p> <p>Share a story every day then talk about the story. Can you describe the character? What was your favourite part? What do you think they might do next? Can you retell/draw the story?</p>	<p><b>Numeracy and Mathematics</b></p> <p>Pick a number between 0 and 100. Count forwards from this number. Can you also count backwards to get back to the number you started from? <b>Challenge:</b> Can you make a number line to show your counting?</p>	<p><b>Health and Wellbeing</b></p> <p>Make a kindness calendar, plan an act of kindness for each month of 2024 or challenge yourself to a week of kindness before christmas or a month of kindness in January.</p>
<p><b>Literacy and English</b></p> <p>Watch some of this year's new film trailers that are coming to a cinema near you! Choose your favourite and draw a scene from it. Could you add your own ideas. What do you think the film will be like - based on the trailer you have watched.</p>	<p><b>Numeracy and Mathematics</b></p> <p>Roll a dice three times. Add the three numbers together. <b>Challenge:</b> Once you've done this 5 times, can you order your answers from smallest to largest?</p>	<p><b>STEM</b></p> <p>Use salt dough to create a decoration, pot or figure. There are lots of ideas online. <p><b>Literacy and English</b></p> <p>Can you write a shopping list for your dinners this week? What treats would you add to the trolley? Talk about which things would be in the same aisle, why are they grouped together?</p>	<p><b>Numeracy and Mathematics</b></p> <p>Draw a line. Write 0 at one end and 100 at the other end. Ask someone to say a number, can you point to where the number should be? <b>Challenge:</b> write the numbers instead of pointing.</p>	<p><b>Expressive Arts</b></p> <p>Ask the members of your family what their favourite song is. Find out why they like it. How does it make them feel? Is it connected to a memory? Listen to the songs and sing or dance along.</p>
<p><b>Literacy and English</b></p> <p>Play a memory game. 1st person says: I went to the shops and I bought (item1) 2nd person says: I went to the shops and I bought (item 1) and (item 2)</p>	<p><b>Numeracy and Mathematics</b></p> <p>Take a look at a calendar (you can get simple ones on google). Talk about January E.g. What day is it tomorrow? How many days until February 9th? What month comes next? <b>Challenge:</b> Write today's date in words and numbers.</p>	<p><b>Social Studies</b></p> <p>Find out about celebrations in another country. What do they celebrate? What do they eat? Do they have gifts? Do they celebrate on the same day? How do they decorate their homes?</p>
