Medication

Data Capture and PC Forms

Digital Consent and Pupil Pledge

Alongside the annual data check there will also be a form about parental / carer consent for iPads and Chromebooks and the Pupil Pledge which details the expectations for safe and appropriate use of devices in school and at home. PLease take time to read, complete and return to school at your

earliest convenience. Devices will begin to be sent home after the September weekend and after we have received consent slips.

Entry points into the school

PLease remind your child that if they do not attend breakfast club in the morning, they should enter the school via the atrium doors and should only come through the office if the gates are locked (usually around 9am).

Waterproof Jackets and Suncream

Please can children be sent to school every day with a waterproof jacket. We try to get the children out come rain or shine as we know that fresh air and exercise aids concentration and focus. It is really important that children have a jacket to allow them to go outside in spite of wet weather. Of course, in extreme weather conditions, we will have an inside playtime. Equally, if the weather is looking warm and sunny, please ensure suncream is applied before coming to school.
