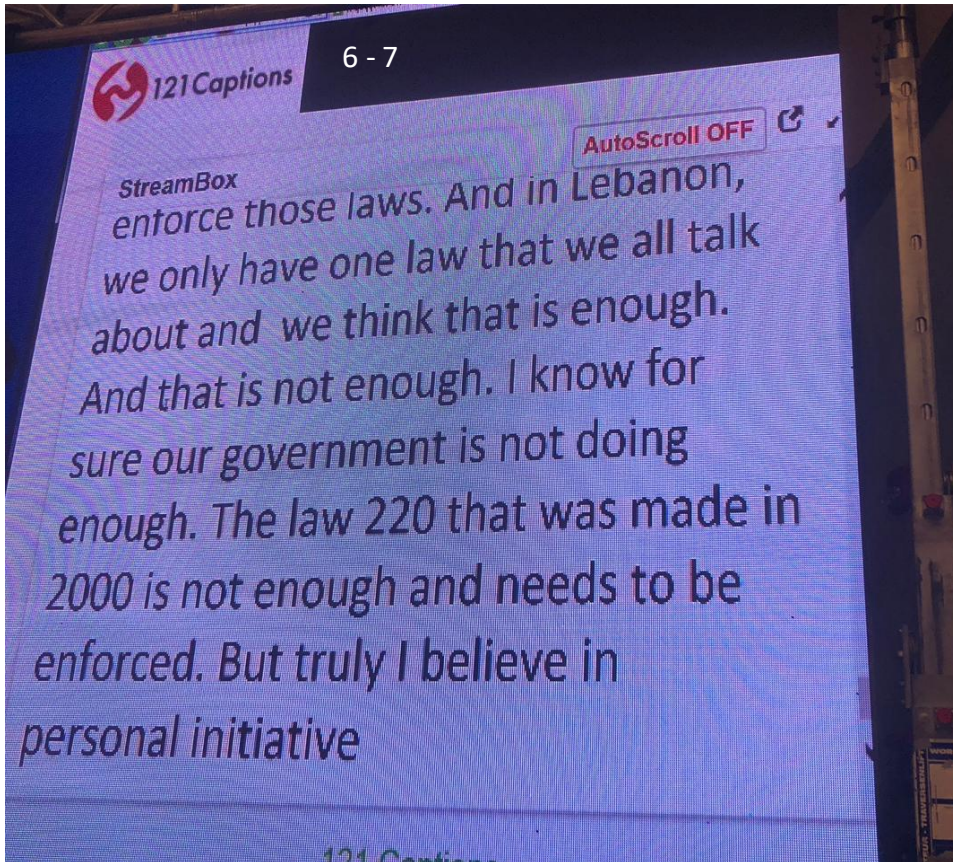

Lingual Accessibility



1. The speaker speaks sign language or English or Arabic on stage
2. For sign language speakers, the interpreter translates to English speech
3. The translation booth translate to Arabic/English
4. The sign language interpreters, interpret to two sign languages (International and American) or English
5. The camera transmits audio visual to 121 Captions in the UK for live transcription
6. 121 Captions in the UK transcribes live on a connected computer
7. The camera and the computer feed dual input to the big screen on stage with sign language and live captions

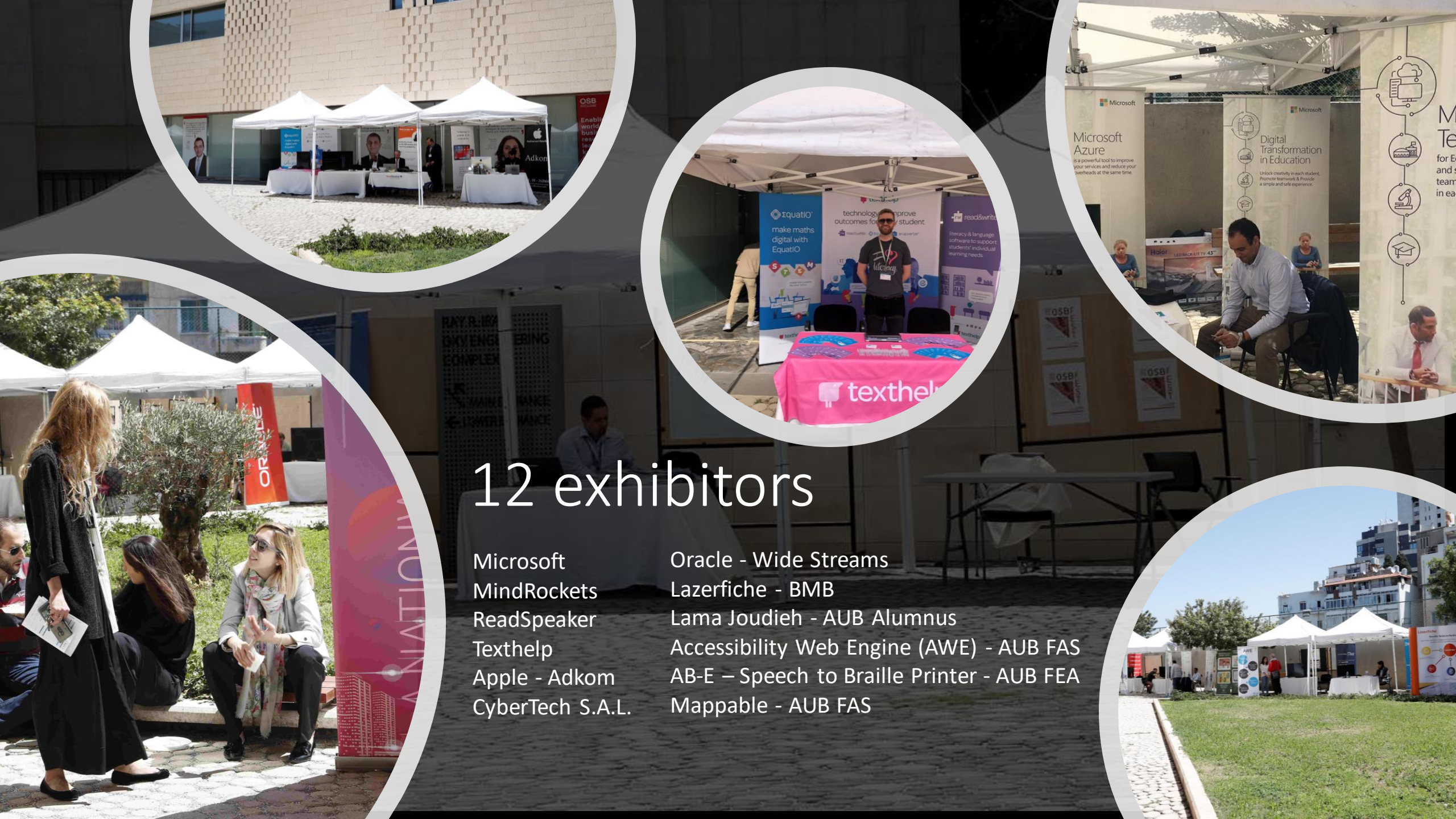

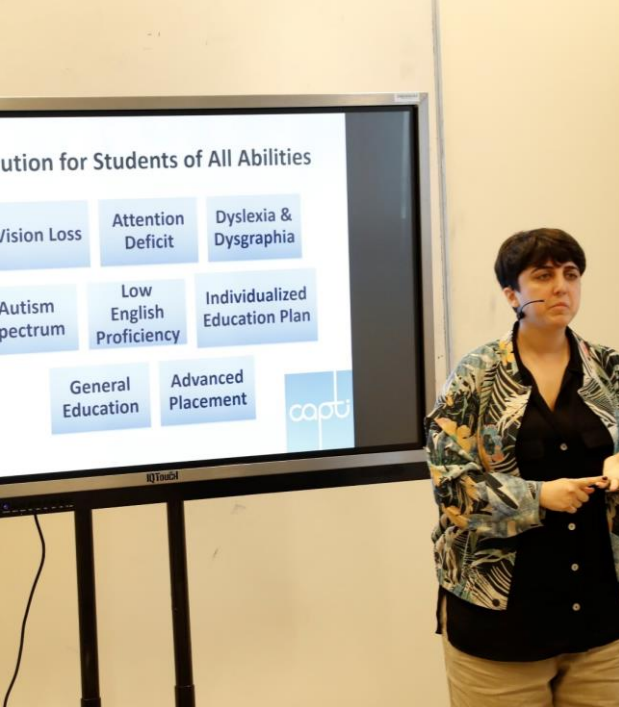

ABLE 2019 Outcomes

- Helped connect special needs students with administration to support enrollment
- Led the first Lebanese participation in the Global Accessibility Awareness Day (GAAD) 2019
- Led 3 Web Accessibility sprints at AUB for staff, students and the public introducing techniques for inclusive web design
- Fostered 3 innovative students' projects (Automated Braille-Encoder, Mappable (campus accessibility navigation guide), Accessibility Web Engine (AWE)). These projects were exhibited during ABLE and are now being developed for deployment.
- Started REACH (Research for Education Accessibility Challenges), a collaboration with AUB's Department of Education, ABLE and the NGO T.I.E.S that focuses on inclusive education practices and tools. This collaboration will result in research and practical events.
- Created Arabic language accessibility to the "Global Accessibility Awareness Day" webpage and "Be My Eyes" application – courtesy of Anis Jradah @ AUBIT
- Started collaboration with AUB's Human Resources department in cooperation with the NGO ProAble to conduct inclusive employment training in addition to inclusive recruitment cooperation.
- Partnered with the Office of Communications to elevate communications accessibility and spread awareness starting with accessible design tips and e-mail accessibility
- Conducted training for the IT staff on inclusive design
- Developed policies for Enterprise Accessibility, IT Procurement, Solution Development and e-Learning





Next steps

- Establish the ABLE Advisory Board (leaders from leading global organizations)
- Establish AUB Accessibility Executive Committee (cross functional)
- Train the IT support staff on inclusive IT support and commonly used assistive solutions
- Remedy all online content including AUB website, LMS (Moodle) and SIS (Banner)
- Insert an inclusive employment model in the HR courses/curriculum (in progress)
- Inserting a web accessibility model in the Computer Science curriculum (in progress)
- Avail braille printing in the libraries and central computer labs (in progress)
- Establish the ABLE students club to support accessibility projects and inclusion activities including peer support (in progress)
- Offer training and online courses through CEC
- Library content remedy (remedy unreadable PDF)
- Establish a Undergraduate Preparation Program (UPP) for special needs
- Pilot full learning content digital accessibility at a designated faculty
- Awareness sessions and training for the university executive key members
- Establish a center for Accessibility Development (research and capacity building) in partnership with industry leaders (ex: Microsoft)
- Fundraising to support digital inclusion and enterprise accessibility (web content remedy and assistive technology)
- Establish a collaboration chain for quality and knowledge dissemination with specialized NGOs, MEHE and MOSA
- Web Accessibility training via the IT and Engineering syndicates
- Accessible Authoring and inclusive design training at AUB and other public entities such as MOSA and MEHE
