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Introduction



- Lack of financial support to create an inclusive educational environment



- Take advantage of new innovations to design/develop solution for everyone including PWDs (people with disabilities)
- Curricula and delivery methods need to change to meet the needs of students with special needs



TOPIC

• The Specially-Abled Student Journey: from admission to graduation

INSIGHTS

- PWDs face lot of physical, psychological and educational difficulties in universities that are not properly equipped to accommodate them
- The university resources require capacity building to provide needed accommodation and support the success of students with special needs

OUTCOMES

- The most important factor is the emotional, physical and technical support that the university offer to students with special needs
- Every institute, especially universities, needs to have an accessible education office that facilitates the students' journey at list as a first step

INSIGHTS

- There isn't a central entity to govern all PWDs affairs
- Existing laws for inclusion are not being applied fully
- Lebanese Government lack sync across ministries in digitization and data
- Lebanese law doesn't distinguish between the different types of disabilities (physical and psychological) which makes it complicated for organizations to set adaption rules for each type

- Obligatory legislations need to be applied to implement inclusion guidelines
- Accessibility and integration should be considered in the governmental digitization plan
- Digital Accessibility must be a roadmap with defined priorities and milestones to push the government, with the help of international experts, to take a series of practical and pragmatic decisions

ABLE 2019 Outcomes





Led the first Lebanese participation in the Global Accessibility Awareness Day (GAAD) 2019



Fostered 3 innovative students' projects (Automated Braille-Encoder, Mappable (campus accessibility navigation guide), Accessibility Web Engine (AWE)).



Started REACH (Research for Education Accessibility Challenges), a collaboration with AUB's Department of Education, ABLE and T.I.E.S that focuses on inclusive education practices and tools.



Started collaboration with AUB's Human Resources department in cooperation with the NGO ProAbled to conduct inclusive employment training in addition to inclusive recruitment



Partnered with the Office of Communications to elevate communications accessibility and spread awareness starting with accessible design tips and e-mail accessibility



Established the ABLE Advisory Board (leaders from leading global organizations)



Established the ABLE students club to support accessibility projects and inclusion activities including peer support



Next Steps



- Establish AUB Accessibility Steering Committee (cross functional)
- Set a plan to ensure full accessibility of key digital services (Student Information System (SIS), Learning Management System (LMS), online services, Websites, etc.)
- Train the IT support staff on inclusive IT support and commonly used assistive solutions
- Remedy all online content including AUB website, LMS (Moodle) and SIS (Banner)
- Insert an inclusive employment model in the Human Resources management courses/curriculum (in progress)
- Inserting a web accessibility model in the Computer Science curriculum (in progress)
- Avail braille printing in the libraries and central computer labs (in progress)
- Offer training and online accessibility courses through CEC (Continuing Education Center)
- Library content remedy (remedy unreadable PDF)
- Establish an Undergraduate Preparation Program (UPP) for special needs to start in Fall 2020-2021 in collaboration with a specialized NGO SMILES (in progress)
- Established a certificate program at CEC to prepare PWDs for independent living to start in Fall 2020-2021 in collaboration with a specialized NGO SMILES (in progress)
- Pilot full learning content digital accessibility at a designated faculty
- Awareness sessions and training for the university executive key members (in progress)
- Establish a center for Accessibility Development (research and capacity building) in partnership with industry leaders
- Fundraising to support digital inclusion and enterprise accessibility (web content remedy and assistive technology)
- Establish a collaboration chain for quality and knowledge dissemination with specialized NGOs,
 MEHE and MOSA
- Web Accessibility training via the IT and Engineering syndicates
- Accessible Authoring and inclusive design training at AUB and other public entities such as MOSA and MEHE

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
