Amplifying Voices: How Technology Fosters Civil Rights Participation for Persons with Disabilities

The panel emphasized the critical need for accessible voting methods and opportunities for civic participation to uphold integrity and equality, using the most recent municipal elections as a case study.

O2 Fireside Chat AI for Accessibility

The panel critically evaluated Al's potential to enhance accessibility, balanced against its drawbacks, such as algorithmic biases and the risk of neglecting traditional accessibility measures in favor of Al solutions. They highlighted the necessity for a nuanced approach that maximizes Al's benefits while addressing its shortcomings to ensure a comprehensive and inclusive support system.

O3 Student Journey

In this panel, Jeremy Seda, Ali Sharaf, May Talhouk, and Tia Manoukian shared insights from their personal journey as students with disabilities or learning difficulties, highlighting some of the tools or people who were instrumental in empowering them.

National Strategy for Accessibility

The panel analyzed the imperatives driving Lebanon's national accessibility strategy, focusing on its strategic objectives to dismantle physical, digital, and social barriers for people with disabilities. Priorities include policy overhaul, infrastructural adjustments, and elevating accessibility awareness, aiming at holistic societal participation and improved life quality for affected individuals.

Mohammad currently works at Whish Money as a Data Processing Clerk. His first job was at a call center, where he had to change his display name to 'Nour' because of his feminine voice. He never lost hope and advocates for equal opportunities.
