
ABOUT THIS PIECE

The artwork here is just as much in the shadow as it is in the sculpture itself sincw this pieces is about accepting my shadow self.

In this final piece for my graduate diploma course at the Royal College of Art, my love of found objects became a celebration rather than a point of suffering, so I created a bust of my alter ego. I deconstructed and reassembled found objects as a process of transformation, exploring my British Jewish female identity and subverting imposed narratives like the Jewish seductress or the scavenger stereotype. The sculpture, made from scavenged materials, reimagines contemporary expressions of eroticism. Hand-sewn, dried banana skins and fiery copper hint at sensuality, while the fragile, transparent nature of the bust convey a sensitivity. The dismantled baby rocker suggests a body in restraint or recovery—an ongoing theme in my work. The Nike trainers reference my Britishness and the childhood longing for a pair I couldn't afford.

I aimed to create a piece that speaks to women everywhere who have felt broken-showing that we are imperfectly powerful, unique, flawed, and ultimately sublime.







ABOUT THIS PIECE

I keep coming back to the idea of women as both hunters and gatherers in my work, imagining a utopian future where women rule the world. This was heavily inspired by one of my favorite fashion collections, Alexander McQueen's Plato's Atlantis, which envisioned a world where women rise from the water and take over the land.

The figures I paint shift between human and animal—blurring the line between the two. The canvas is where I let my raw, animalistic instincts take over, unfiltered and unashamed, even when they feel at odds with the structures we live in.

ABOUT THIS PIECE

While walking along the canal in London Fields, I was stopped by an abandoned textile draped over a gate. Matted and tangled with fishing hooks, plastic debris, and fragments of a scarf, it seemed salvaged from the canal, shaped by the pressure of the lock.

In the studio, I unfolded its vast, two-meter length. Hideous yet sublime, it overwhelmed me, sparking a spiritual reflection on suffering, endurance, and the beauty that emerges through resilience. This textile became central to my project: I wore it in performance, transformed it into readymade installations, and sculpted with it.



Hanging wall sculpture


Medium: Liquid latex, black latex ink, imbedded with cling film

Dimensions: 43 x 20 x 4cm




I think of the body as a second skin—intimate, fragile, and sometimes confining. Working with black liquid latex allows me to approach the human form as something to be freed, much like a butterfly breaking free from its cocoon. The deep black of the latex speaks to the erotic, while its heavy, textured surface captures the raw imperfections of skin. This bodice is a shedding, a transformation—a moment of becoming, like a snake casting off its skin to reveal something new.

ABOUT THIS PIECE

Photography and writing are integral to my practice, which takes an autoethnographic approach. On the right, I have displayed an A4 sheet of freeflowing writing that reflects on different aspects of my life and what shapes my identity. This text is layered over a photograph I took of a smashed car headlight—its fractured form resembling a piercing, almost animalistic eye. To the left, my self-portrait mirrors this gaze, creating a visual dialogue between human and machine.

I was drawn to the connection between the robotic, eye-like nature of the headlight and the primal, instinctive quality of the self-portrait. This interplay speaks to my fascination with the relationship between women, animals, and the evolving presence of technology in our lives. Both pieces have been displayed behind pieces of acetate that I found continuing my interest in found objects.

ABOUT THIS PIECE

The compsoition of this wall sculpture was designed to combine both a gun and cross. By doing so I am drawing a direct visual connection between violence and religion, not as a statement of truth, but as a way of posing a question to the viewer. By flaking away areas of found wood and gradually building up the form, the process itself reflects my conceptual interest in deconstructionism-breaking down and rebuilding through found objects and material in order to understand the world.
