





# The Art & Flea Project



For Art & Flea, a traveling flea market across six Indian cities, I designed an animation where a light purple bird soars through iconic skylines, weaving a narrative of exploration and connection. Each city is distilled into a single defining symbol—Durga for Kolkata, Ganesh for Mumbai—capturing its essence in a glance.

The soft purple and yellow palette evokes warmth and nostalgia, while the desi minimal aesthetic balances tradition with modernity. The bird's seamless flight mirrors the organic, ever-evolving nature of flea markets—where stories, craft, and culture intertwine.

Beyond branding, this animation creates an identity that feels personal and immersive, transforming Art & Flea into more than a market—it becomes a journey, celebrating India's creative spirit.

# Banglar Jigsaw

The Bengal Puzzle I made is a wooden art piece that symbolizes the historical and cultural ties between Bangladesh and West Bengal, India.

Once a unified image, now fragmented, the puzzle can only be forcefully reassembled—reflecting the complexities of their shared history. Digitally painted, printed, and laser-cut, it offers both visual and tactile engagement.

Each puzzle piece represents a fragment of shared heritage, blending urban evolution with personal nostalgia—such as flower shop that still looks like a fragment of the same image in both countries. The forced reassembly of the puzzle mirrors the complexities of Bengal's divided yet interconnected history, making it both a physical and conceptual reflection of identity.







# The Artefact

My animation and flipbook project finds its roots in an artifact that stands as both a wound and a roar—a protest carved into form. It speaks of the Bengal Partition, of power slicing through land and lives, of a past fractured yet unforgotten. Inspired by Rabindranath Tagore's rejection of knighthood, its rigid cuts tell a story of resistance, of a nation refusing to be caged. But within these sharp edges, the tiger still moves—wounded, yet unyielding. It strides through the divide, its spirit undimmed, a testament to a history that may be scarred but never silenced.

# Ideation & Development

"Trail of a Tiger" explores resilience and identity through the metaphor of the Bengal tiger—an enduring symbol of strength, survival, and defiance. Bengal's history is woven with stories of resistance, from Rabindranath Tagore's reflections on nature and human spirit to Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay's nationalist fervor and Mahasweta Devi's portrayals of struggle. These narratives shaped my understanding of perseverance, mirroring the tiger's unyielding energy.










# Flipbook

## Future Development

I am exploring the use of rotational mechanisms to create a zoetrope as part of my artefact and animation practice. The rotating motion will animate the tiger, enhancing the fluidity of its movement and creating a dynamic visual experience. I plan to integrate light and shadow play, where the rotating elements interact with light to cast shifting shadows, adding depth to the piece and enriching its narrative.

Looking ahead, I aim to incorporate selfillumination into the design, with the zoetrope glowing as it spins. Additionally, I want to use the rotational movement to generate electricity, making the zoetrope self-sustaining. This sustainable approach energy consumption will minimize while enhancing the visual and sensory By combining experience. artistic exploration with the generation of power, I aim to push the boundaries of animation, physical interaction, and environmental consciousness.



#### Ideation

This project exploressomething that's never been tried before. Sustainable papermaking through the use of shola pith—a traditional, lightweight, milky-white plant material native to Bengal. Drawing inspiration from Japanese papermaking techniques, I experimented with the process of turning this biodegradable material into a delicate, handmade paper resembling fine art paper. My intention was to honour both craft and ecology by transforming waste or natural by-products into usable creative surfaces.

Shola, often used in Bengali ceremonial crafts, holds deep cultural significance. Integrating it into a papermaking process allowed me to bridge regional traditions with contemporary sustainable design. The paper was created through a slow, immersive technique involving pulping, sheet forming, and natural drying, resulting in a textured, fibrous finish that retains the softness and subtle sheen of shola.

This tactile experiment serves as a foundation for future works in visual storytelling and design. I envision this handmade paper being used in printmaking, drawing, or animation, bringing new life to discarded or overlooked materials. This project is a step towards integrating environmental responsibility with communication design—where materiality is not just a surface but part of the narrative itself.





### Marbles in the Dust

Marbles in the Dust is a visual poem exploring the quiet intensity of farewell. It follows three figures—Tirtha, Keshav, and Rafi—in a final moment by a railway track. A green marble, small yet symbolic, holds the weight of memory, innocence, and things left unsaid. The work began with chorra—rhythmic verses in Bengali and English—written in response to my grandfather's diary, which documents his memories around the Bengal Partition.


These verses formed the emotional spine of a poem-book, where each illustration unfolds like a held breath.Drawn in fine lines on textured, handmade paper, the visuals translate rhythm into gesture and pause. I continued working with shola pith for its softness and fragility, allowing the material to echo the story's tone. This project holds not just the moment of parting, but what remains—suspended in memory, silence, and the unfinished spaces between people.
