Generative AI – ChatGPT etc. –DMJX rules:

Thoughts about sound use and attribution:

"... sound academic and journalistic principles entails consistently attributing sources when introducing ideas or assertions not originating from oneself. This principle equally extends to the utilization of generative AI."

If AI tools are used, it is imperative "to concisely delineate this utilization".

"Presented assignment responses must embody independently produced work."

When AI meets GDPR or copyright: Your responsibility. When AI meets source list: Attribute correctly, APA.

Al-generated illustrations:

Al tools may be used to create illustrations (photo, video, audio), but not (photo)realistic illustra could be mistaken for documentation






